
Launch Tip of the Month June 2023

Microsoft Windows 11 has a new look and new features. Most of the changes in Windows have been well received but change, even good change, can sometimes be unsettling. One objection I have heard is that the Start menu is now centered on the taskbar. Its position changes as you add more icons to the taskbar.



Would you like it back where it was in Windows 10? If so, your wish is granted!

- 1. Press Windows+S to put your cursor in the Search box (or click the Start menu).
- 2. Type Settings and press Enter.





5. Select Taskbar behaviors.



6. Change the Taskbar alignment setting to Left.



And now it's back to where you are used to seeing it!
